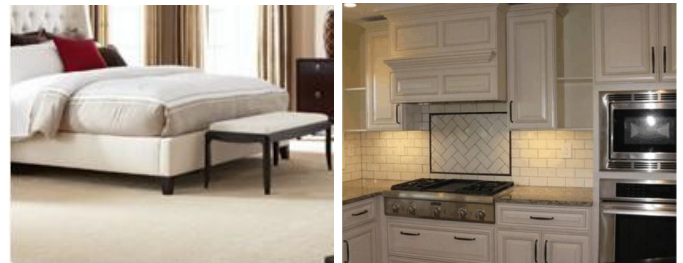

Tom Andrew, a member of Greater Lafayette Commerce's Federal Government Committee just returned from this group's annual trip to Washington, D.C. During their two day visit members met with Indiana Senators, Joe Donnelly and Dan Coats, and House Representative Todd Rokita.

The GLC group also met with the Energy & Environment Panel, the National Republican Senatorial Committee, the Democratic Governors Association, U.S. Chamber of Commerce, Federal Rail Administration and Brian Lamb at C-SPAN. Brian Lamb, a Lafayette native, noted he enjoyed seeing his third generation of Andrew's in government relations, as well as the contingent of fellow Lafayette Jeff alumni in the group.

Tom remarked, "We were able to meet with our senators and reps. It is nice to be able to have a relationship in Washington. It

would be a tough place to navigate if you knew no one. In our stop at the Federal Railroad Administration we met with the director in the Office of Policy and Planning. We discussed possible funding sources for the Hoosier State Line commuter rail service and the economic development impact in our area. It was meetings similar to this 35 years ago that started the railroad reloca-

tion project in downtown Lafayette."

Upon his return Tom noted, "Each trip gives me a lot more experience in understanding how local government works with our representatives and agencies in Washington. I hope to make the trip one year with my dad. I'm sure I'd gain a great deal from his perspective."

### Kelly McTague – A Man of Many Skills

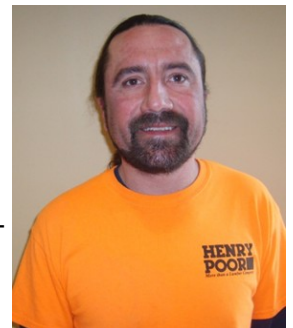
